How and why did you move into your current role within clinical research?

I arrived in the UK 12 years ago to study English. Although my education and career history in Colombia had been in finance and accountancy, supporting my English studies was more important than pursuing a “career” at the time, so I financed my studies through roles which allowed me time to continue learning. This led me to a position within the Estates team at the Royal Bournemouth

Hospital I found the work and environment at the hospital really interesting. I subsequently became a Data Manager with the research team at RBH, later progressing to a Project Co-ordinator, and when the opportunity to work with the financial side of research became available, I knew it was a good fit for me.

What does your role as Research Finance entail on a typical day at UHD?

There is no typical day in my job, some days I will be in meetings with different departments or sponsor representatives; reviewing new study budgets, protocols, study manuals, CRF guidelines, meetings with members of the study team and the sponsor; reviewing various hospitals systems and study information to do reconciliation; comparing POs against EDGE finances to raise invoices and then income distributions. Processing travel expenses, training staff, etc. – every day is different, which I really enjoy!

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What does the patient and research landscape currently look like at UHD?

Across our 3 hospitals we typically have 300-400 studies running, recruiting around 4000 participants per year. We take part in a healthy number of commercially sponsored studies.

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You’ve been using EDGE for almost 9 years. How do you personally utilise EDGE in your daily role?

Within my current role I use the EDGE Finance facilities along with the EDGE Finance Tools developed by Stevie Barre and Mat Davis to invoice and reconcile the study finances to ensure that all outstanding activity payments are recorded and recovered. We also use attributes and workflows for study finance management/budget negotiation/reconciliation and reporting. I worked with Mat and Stevie to help develop the new Apportioning/Income Distribution

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tools used in-house, which have now been shared with the EDGE community.

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What is your favourite functionality to use in EDGE and why?

Obviously, the Finance features within EDGE are the most relevant to my daily role, but everything from recruitment data, study information, attributes, workflows, and notes come into play most days.

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In what ways has your use of EDGE changed and evolved over the past 9 years?

As both my role and my organisation's use of EDGE have evolved over the years, so too, has my daily use of EDGE. From recording recruitment and generating basic reports for sponsor feasibility responses, to using EDGE for most Research activities; saving main study documents, recording patient appointments, study costs, global calendar (annual leave, monitor visits, training sessions, etc.), workflows for various activities, attributes (to record local processes and discussion with various departments), assigning local study IDs, and more complex reports (to assess our finances, C&C, workload, etc.).

What are your/site's plans for using and developing EDGE over the next 12 months?

As well as watching the EDGE 3 Familiarisation videos from the EDGE team, we have also had internal sessions looking at EDGE 3. I'm looking forward to the improved finance facilities and invoice recording. I'm excited

to see what further development may come in future!

If you could offer one tip for new users working in finance management, what would it be?

Spend some time learning to get the most out of reporting in EDGE (or find someone (Mat) in your team to help you). There is often a need to combine different EDGE reports to be able to view the data in the most useful way – for example, comparing finance activity by specialty, PI, or division. I'm hopeful that greater flexibility in the finance reports will come in future EDGE 3 updates!
